


March Newsletter

1st place - Japan (Berat, William, Yusuf, Jessica, Nazra and Daniella)


2nd place – Brazil (Ditmir, Alex, Emily W, Olivia and Ariana)

Year 5 and 6 KNEX Challenge


Year 5 and Year 6 participated in the KNEX challenge. They worked in pairs to create a fairground ride, considering safety and stability.





















World Book Day Dance Workshops










Year 3 Celtic Harmony















Nursery Rhyme Time

Stars of the week




